AMESSAGE Melegran The school year is off to a great start, and it is hard to believe we are already through one quarter of the year! This time of year is always full of excitement and busy schedules. We have had a great start with our four-day instructional week and students have been busy with various fall sports and activities. It is also that time of year that schools are focused on two important "E's": enrollment and elections.

October 1st is the deadline for what is called certified enrollment, and that process is finalized on October 15th. This is when we officially determine the number of students in our district for funding. This year we have some very positive news in that our certified enrollment number is up by two students. This may not seem like much, but the vast majority of schools across lowa are experiencing declining enrollment. Those hit especially hard have been rural schools. We have been able to negate that trend and see a stable and slightly increasing certified enrollment over the course of the past three years. I truly believe that this is a testament to the work our teachers do on a daily basis as well as the great things the community has to offer.

The other major "E" we are focused on is elections. One important funding mechanism that we rely heavily upon is something called the Physical Plant and Equipment Levy or PPEL. This levy can be used for a number of expenditures including construction of buildings, purchasing property, buses and technology, and energy conservation expenditures. It cannot be used for staff salaries or supplies as those must come from our general fund. Our district has had a voter-approved PPEL in place for over 30 years, and on November 4th, we are asking voters to extend that levy. This WILL NOT increase the tax rate for district patrons, and we will continue to utilize the funds for ongoing facility maintenance needs of our district. These funds generate roughly \$95,000 per year and are generated from a combination of property tax and income surtax. Without this levy, we will be required to fund these expenditures from other sources, most notably our general fund. This would place an additional burden on that fund that we use over 80% of to fund salaries and benefits. We do not take lightly asking our voters for continuation of this levy during difficult economic times. However, we feel that the continuation of the PPEL levy is in the best interest of our students, staff, and community as we continue to be committed to providing the highest quality education to our students. It's been a great start at Baxter Elementary; our students and staff have jumped right into the work and are already seeing optimistic data. During the first few weeks of school, our students learn and engage in appropriate behaviors in our common areas. This creates a school-wide understanding of the accepted behaviors and expectations in and around school. The common understanding drives our behavior protocols and provides clarity to students and staff alike. In each classroom, our teams create social contracts for agreements on behavior as it relates specifically to the learning environment. These contracts help provide easily understandable agreements, peer to peer, peer to adult, and adult to peer. These initial expectations and routines help establish a consistent and clear culture for the entire school year.

Some key words all students have been learning and using these initial weeks of school include kindness and respect. We have our kindness kickoff, which helps encourage students to choose kindness in all settings. We have daily and weekly time set aside towards learning about important character traits of kindness, respect, responsibility, gratitude, empathy, perseverance, honesty, cooperation, courage, and creativity. We celebrate our learning and application of these characteristics each month at our assembly. Students clap, cheer, and encourage each other for their positive impacts, and then we always celebrate with a school-wide acknowledgment. You can always follow along with our fun and daily happenings on our Baxter Elementary Facebook page.

Over the course of the school year, we have time dedicated to professional learning and development for our staff. During pre-service, we were able to attend a speaker, Brian Mendler, who spoke of the importance of relationships, believing in all, and being a champion for kids. It was a strong message and emphasized a key area of our Baxter mission, vision, and collective commitments. An elementary specific area of learning revolves around writing instruction. We have partnered with a leader in the field to bolster our curriculum and instruction, specifically in writing. This area of growth was determined by reflective data of teachers and local classroom data collection. Our elementary teachers have a strong belief in continued improvement and finding ways to model lifelong learning to our students. This is just another example of their commitment, and we are encouraged to see how the content-specific learning impacts all.

Our WINN times have hit the ground running and aim to provide a multi-tiered level of support for students. An area of emphasis this year is around math fact fluency and the importance of students gaining mastery of facts through a calculated process, starting with conceptual knowledge, leading to reasoning skills, and ending with abstract automaticity. We aim to provide students with the skills and knowledge needed for personal success. Our school is constantly changing and evolving in practices based on our previous experiences, building on the successes and altering the less impactful practices.

Our Big Bolt Little Bolt program is successfully underway. This program pairs a high school "big" with an elementary "little" and they meet weekly to build trusting relationships throughout the district. This past month, they were an integral part of the tree planting at both our school and Giese Park. Also, our SRO, Deputy Britton, has been a tremendous asset to our school team. Most of you will see him before school at drop-off. He is always providing high-fives and smiles, and students are always eager to interact with him and his companion, the most popular four-legged friend, John. We appreciate his commitment to our students, staff, and community.

As you can tell, I am proud of the work we have done together in our elementary school setting. Our students and staff are hard-working, and our continued growth is a testament to that hard work and execution. We have a great staff that supports, collaborates, and believes in high levels of student learning for our students. It's been a great start to fall, and we look forward to continuing our work for the rest of the 2025/26 school year and beyond. There are so many things to be thankful for at Baxter CSD. 
## PEN PALS

## BAXTER COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT --- PARENT/GUARDIAN NOTICE SECTION 504 OF THE REHABILITATION ACT OF 1973

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination against persons with a disability in any program receiving federal financial assistance. In order to fulfill obligations under Section 504, the Baxter Community School District has the responsibility to avoid discrimination in policies and practices regarding its personnel and students. No discrimination against any person with a disability should knowingly be permitted in any of the programs and practices of the school system.

The Baxter Community School District has the responsibilities under Section 504, which included the obligations to identify, evaluate, and, if the student is determined to be eligible under Section 504, to afford access to appropriate educational services.

If the parent/guardian disagrees with the determination made by the professional staff of the school district, he/she has a right to file a grievance and to a hearing with an impartial hearing officer.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) also specifies rights related to educational records. This Act gives the parent or guardian the right to:

1) Inspect and review his/her child's educational records; 2) Make copies of these records; 3) Receive a list of the individuals having access to those records; 4) Ask for an explanation of any item in the records; 5) Ask for an amendment to any report on the grounds that it is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the child's rights; and 6) A hearing on the issue if the school refuses to make the amendment.
